What is Mastery Readiness?

Mastery Readiness is a bespoke programme, designed to support schools as they take the first steps towards adopting a Teaching for Mastery approach in their maths classrooms. This is the first of four DfE funded years which will see schools working alongside one another in a collaborative and supportive nature.

"I have learnt more about maths on this course than I did at University. My maths subject knowledge is better than it has ever been and I can now share this with colleagues."

What are the advantages of working in a Mastery Readiness Work Group?

The training includes an introduction to mastery, how to prepare a school to be ready to implement teaching for mastery, initial steps, both in leadership and in classroom teaching, and strategies to overcome potential barriers.

- Support for the headteacher in addressing leadership issues related to maths and contributing to raising standards.
- Opportunity to work closely with other schools also developing Mastery Readiness.

Workshops

Your school will be part of a group of schools from across our region working together, both online and face-to-face at workshops. Your Maths Lead and another teacher (along with the headteacher initially) will attend these sessions run by our experienced Teaching for Mastery team.

"Our mindset as teachers has changed and the ways we have approached maths have changed. We are now all on the same page now about what we want and the way forward".

Regular bespoke support visits

In addition to these face to face sessions, one of our Teaching for Mastery Readiness Leads will visit your school regularly over the academic year. In this bespoke programme of support, they will work alongside teachers and leaders to support in the development of school systems, the mathematical mindsets of pupils and the subject knowledge of teachers

Covid-19 Recovery

Many positive lessons were learnt from online collaboration during Maths Hubs activity in 2020/21. These will be built upon in 2021/22. As the impact of the pandemic hopefully recedes, the result for our work will be a blend of face-to-face activities and frequent online collaboration
