What is Mastery Embedding?

The embedding teaching for mastery programme is for schools that participated in the development work groups in the previous year. It will involve scaling up teaching for mastery approaches from the lead participants' classrooms to ensure practises across school are consistently adopted.

What are the advantages of working in a Mastery Embedding Work Group?

Participants and their schools will:

- ✓ Enhance their mathematical subject knowledge, emphasizing key areas of maths
- ✓ Cultivate a deep understanding of the principles and pedagogy of mastery
- ✓ Understand the school-wide structures which enable staff to develop mastery approaches
- ✓ Develop the ability to plan, teach and reflect on lessons with a mastery approach
- ✓ Establish a set of principles, policies, practices and systems which embody a teaching for mastery approach

A closer look: What does Mastery Embedding look like in the Great North Maths Hub?

Workshops

Participants will work with school leaders and classroom practitioners in six workshops across the year, establishing systems of professional development which support continual improvement and refinement with and across schools.

Bespoke Support Visit

There will be one school visit from the Primary Mastery Specialist leading the work group, to support embedding changes within each school.

Covid-19 Recovery

Many positive lessons were learnt from online collaboration during Maths Hubs activity in 2020/21. These will be built upon in 2021/22. As the impact of the pandemic hopefully recedes, the result for our work will be a blend of face-to-face activities and frequent online collaboration
